<b>2.</b>	<b><u>Presentation of Resolution No. 102-10</u> – The Mayor stated that she had not seen the “Face of the City” design features for this item. Traffic Engineer Collins explained this item and stated that he would brief the Mayor on the design features following the City Commission Agenda Review.</b>
<b>19.</b>	<b><u>Resolution No. 104-10(F) and Resolution No. 105-10(F)</u> – The Mayor announced that this item was deleted from the agenda.</b>
<b>15.</b>	<b><u>Resolution No. 130-10</u> – The Mayor suggested that this item be pulled from the Consent Calendar for discussion, since she had read in a newspaper that Commissioner Mitchell stated that she may not support it. Deputy City Administrator Miller announced that a press conference regarding this item will be held on Monday, March 22, 2010 before the City Commission Meeting.</b>
<b>8.</b>	<b><u>Resolution No. 117-10</u> – Assistant to the City Administrator Melick responded to Commission questions regarding this item. Commissioner Robinson asked that people without computer access be given the same opportunities to receive rewards for being among the first 350 people to register for the event that people who register online would.</b>

9.	<b><u>Resolution No. 119-10</u></b> – Assistant City Administrator Balbis and Deputy City Administrator Miller responded to Commission questions regarding this item.
20C.	<b><u>Resolution No. 134-10(F)</u></b> – Director of Parks and Recreation Thrower, Deputy City Administrator Miller and Assistant to the City Administrator Melick responded to Commission questions regarding this item.
21.	<b><u>Appeal of the Historic Preservation Board decision in case No. 09-51A</u></b> – Historic Preservation Planner Mittner explained this item and responded to Commission questions.
	At this time Commissioner Moss [a] suggested that taxi companies that use hybrid vehicles be given the opportunity to score higher in the Request for Proposal (RFP) for downtown taxi franchises; and [b] suggested the City try to recover the money it invested into the South Florida Water Management District’s (SFWMD) plan to draw water from rock pits to recharge Grassy Waters Preserve, since the project has been halted. Assistant City Administrator Balbis [a] explained the concerns regarding the water quality in the rock pits and the new plans the SFWMD is currently focusing on; and [b] responded to Commission questions.
